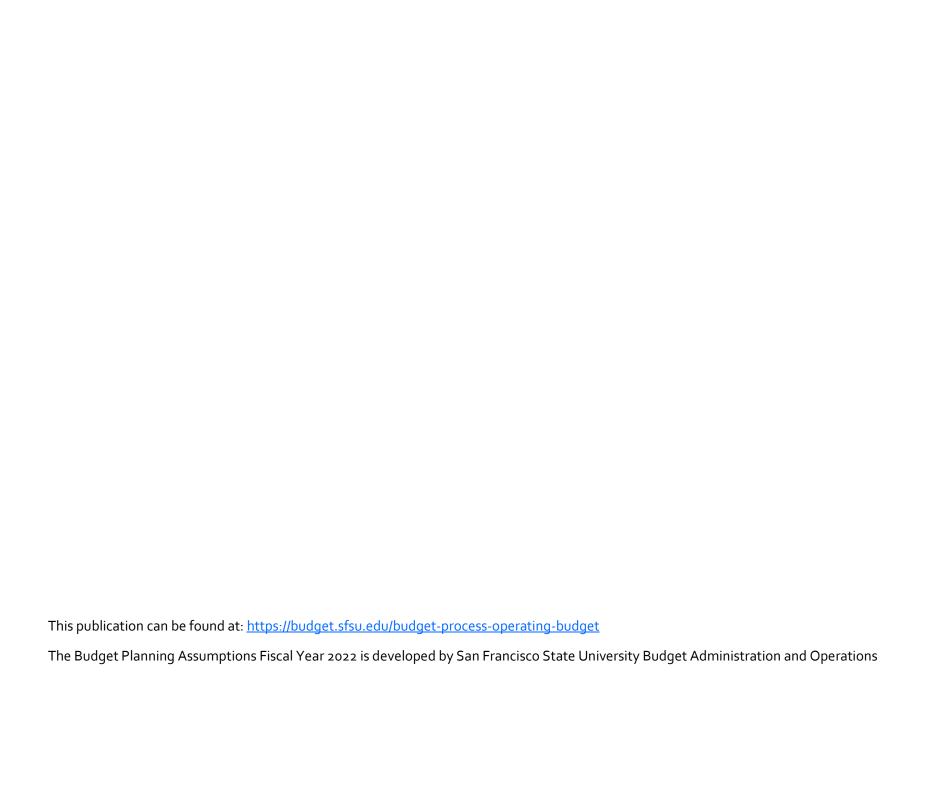

(Academic Senate has agreed to support the minimum wage in the city of San Francisco, rather than the California minimum wage for all student employees at SF State, regardless of the funding source)	On July 1, 2021, the San Francisco minimum wage rate will increase to \$16.32 per Hour. In addition, on July 1, 22021, and each year after that, the minimum wage rate will be adjusted based on the annual increase in the Consumer Price Index. In January 2021, the California minimum wage will increase from \$14/Hour to \$15/Hour.
